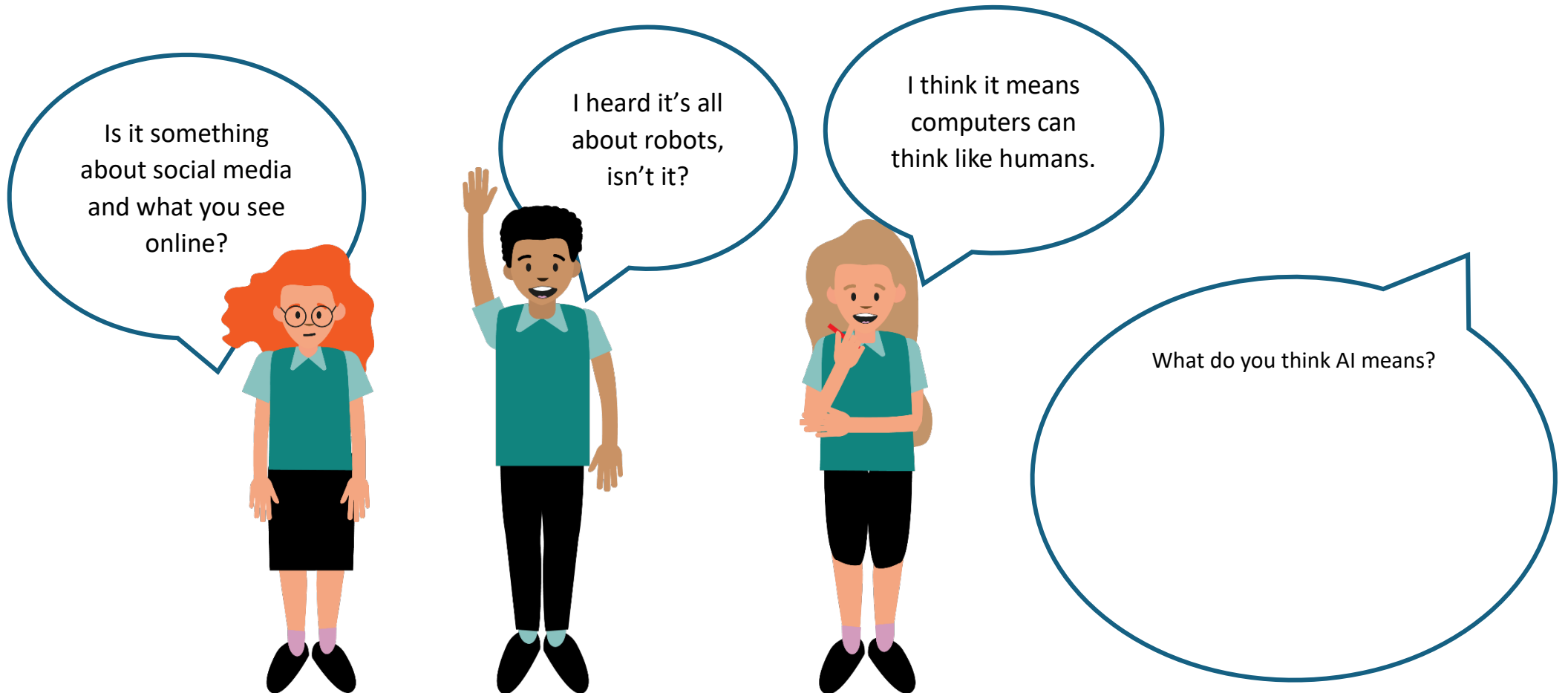


Resource 1: Overheard conversation

The technology used to power AI can cause harm to the environment by producing carbon emissions and using up lots of water.

AI tools can help people with visual or hearing difficulties to access information.	AI can make some online experiences more fun, for example when it is used in games and video recommendations.	AI tools can help find ways to deal with climate change, for example by predicting extreme weather events or monitoring endangered species.	AI can summarise information quickly and make helpful recommendations.
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
