WHAT IS HATE CRIME?

Hate crimes are acts of violence or hostility directed at a person or group of people because of who they are or who someone thinks they are.



THE NINE CHARACTERISTICS OF HATE CRIME

Gloucestershire Police recognise nine characteristics for which people can be a victim of hate crime:

- Disability
- Race or Ethnicity (Race = biology/ physical appearance, Ethnicity = culture, e.g. Black African)
- Religion or Belief (Christian, Muslim, Atheism, Veganism is a belief/a way of life)
- Sexual Orientation (e.g. gay, bi, lesbian, pan sexual)
- Gender identity (transgender)
- Age (most common in Gloucestershire)
- Gender (male or female from birth)
- Alternative subcultures, (e.g. emo's, goths, punks)
- Homelessness

HATE CRIME RESPONSE

Any crime directed at a person because of any of the nine characteristics is a hate crime.

A suspect who commits a hate crime can be dealt with by:

- Arrest / interview
- Police caution
- Court
- Conviction
- Prison

OFFENDERS GUILTY OF A HATE CRIME CAN RECEIVE A TOUGHER SENTENCE.
